Family farmers



In the rural areas where Trias works, farmers and particularly female farmers have little or no access to training,

credit and markets. Trias teaches them to collaborate in strong cooperatives. By working together, the farmers increase their household income and contribute to building a fair society.

As food production grows more efficient, more and more people leave agriculture. In many regions the labour

market is not able to absorb the growing number of job seekers. Trias strengthens entrepreneurs' associations that provide professional business support to their members.





Inclusion

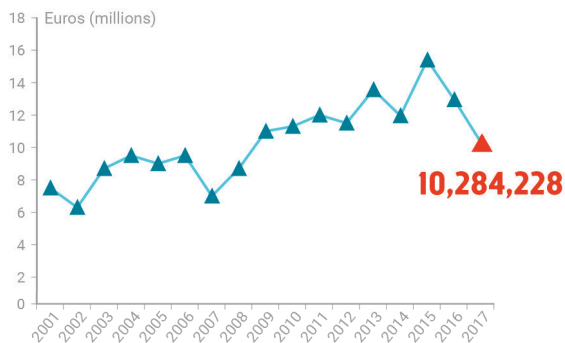
